2020 CBLSL Season Cancellation Due to COVID-19 Pandemic Frequently Asked Questions

1. I have already paid my 2020 season player fee, will I get a refund?

Players who have already paid their fee for the 2020 season have 3 choices:

1. Receive a full refund
2. Receive "site credit" that can be used towards future fees
3. Donate your player fee to the CBLSL*

*Please note: The CBLSL is registered as a 501c4 organization. As such, donations to the CBLSL are not generally tax-deductible.

2. I donated a player scholarship this year, what will happen with that?

All player scholarship donations will be applied to the Fall season or 2021 season.

3. I received a player scholarship for the 2020 Spring/Summer season, will I get one for the Fall season or the 2021 Spring/Summer season?

Players who received scholarships for the 2020 Spring/Summer season will need to re-apply for a scholarship for the Fall season and/or the 2021 Spring/Summer season.

4. I purchased a CBLSL League T-Shirt, how will they be distributed?

Once the Stay at Home Order has been lifted, we will be organizing a meetup where you can pick up your shirts. We will reach out to anyone who has purchased a shirt via email once we are able to schedule the meetup. Social distancing guidelines will be followed at this meetup.

5. Will we still be able to attend the 2020 GSWS in Columbus, OH?

NAGAAA has a target date of 90 days prior to the tournament to give a final decision on the fate of the 2020 GSWS. We will be reaching out to managers for all teams who have previously expressed interest in attending the 2020 GSWS with more information.

6. Will we still be able to attend the 2020 ASANA Softball World Series in Virginia Beach, VA?

The Virginia Beach ASANA Softball World Series has been postponed to 2021.
